CLARC version OF WCT / PERIPLUM SCENE As per 9 July 14

SCENE 1

Inside School Building (CLARC).

- Audience assembles facing indoors in large hall.
- Children led out into hall by teacher (Marion) with Rev Fletcher following.
- Teacher (helped by elder students) gets children standing in rows with adults behind them, standing facing wall.
- Rev Fletcher (Tony), with back to the wall, gives talk to assembled children and audience.
- At end of his talk, TEACHER (MARION orders children to follow her out.
- TEACHER/REV FLETCHER then hides children, somewhere safe, in readiness for their scene.
- Audience then led out through 'emergency exit' via car park close to Forest Garden emergency exit gate.
- SOLDIER appears from road & walks across tarmacked car park carefully.
- He walks slowly towards gate and bangs on gate.

SOLDIER looks at audience. Puts his finger on lips - and thinking they are his platoon – beckons them to follow him into forest garden? (*SOLDIER* – wearing blue boy uniform of hospital, in contrast to rest of WCT).

DAVE as SOLDIER leads audience into garden through wooden gate.

All WCT hidden around site, except Ken who is seated on the 'throne' (different colour costume to camouflaged others?)

As SOLDIER walks the path he triggers WCT members to set off SFX recording 1 – drones and recorded voices - when close to hidden groups.

SOLDIER climbs the hill and salutes, first away from audience, then towards audience.

SFX - SOLDIER triggers Barbara's SFX

SOLDIER comes down hill & leads audience to centre around "fire place"

OLDER WOMAN ON LARGE CHAIR (KEN): Sit down, come on, take a seat, quickly now.

SOLDIER (to audience): Get down, get down.

He watches Ken and listens to recorded voices for a while.

SOLDIER goes to hill and salutes again.

SFX: cue WCT turn down volume on speakers.

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KEN recites Rupert Brooke poem "If I should die, think only this of me"

SFX- drones TRACK 2, volume up

Live voices begin in sequence around site – people move in closer while remaining hidden, if possible

Tuppy: Name...occupation...belief...

Ellie: My sweetheart is in France; I haven't heard from him in 2

months.

Tam/Jean: to be a farmer's boy ...

Tony (plus drum beats): In August 14 we sailed to France..."

Jeff: Smashed and broken ...

Gill: August 4th - gassed....hand gone...chest wound..."

Alec: Name....occupation...belief...

Charlie: Ow! My leg!

Clare: Dear Nurse Coggin, thank you for your kindness in looking after

me.

ALL: Dear Nurse Coggin....add their own letter extract' (listen to

each other's)

David S: Poem about SOLDIER.

Barbara: Rubber overshoes – cordite factory...column of fire

DRUM BEAT - FREEZE

NEXT SECTION, all pop up from hidden position when speaking their own line, maybe moving around perimeter in & out of audience view.

Tuppy: Name?
Alec: Henry Hall
Tuppy: Occupation:
Alec: Carpenter
Tuppy: Belief?

Alec: King and Country

Ellie: My young man is at the front...have you heard from him?

Jean: (Sings "farmer's boy" while moving in.)

Tony: roll on drum. SOLDIER's ballad again. (popping out.)

Jeff: Bruised and battered

Alec Name?

Tuppy: Tommy Arnett
Alec: Occupation?
Tuppy: Butcher
Alec: Belief?

Tuppy: No longer have any. Barbara: Cordite speech

David: Poem

Charlie: Thank you, nurse, for my new leg

Clare: Letter of thanks repeated

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ALL CLAP.

Cacophony of voices speaking all at once as all move to the back of the hill or around. They pick up sticks.

Slowly march up hill. Stop on summit. Slowly descend.

??? PROXEMICS - WHEN TO MOVE THE AUDIENCE?

OPTION 1. DAVE BECKONS AUDIENCE TO STAND AND FOLLOW HIM ACROSS TO MAKE LINE FACING HILL WHERE ARMY IS GATHERING?? ACTORS PASS THROUGH AND SIT HEADS DOWN.

THEN, DAVE TURNS AUDIENCE TO SEE SOLDIERS SITTING HEADS DOWN. PAUSE. ALL RAISE HEADS TO STARE AT AUDIENCE.

AS CHILDREN ENTER, DAVE GETS THEM TO TURN AND WATCH FROM THERE.

THINK THIS VERSION SOUNDS GOOD, THOUGH WILL BE A LITTLE MORE COMPLEX WITH MOVING THROUGH AUDIENCE, SO WHICHEVER YOU FEEL MOST COMFORTABLE WITH...

OPTION 2. AUDIENCE STAY SEATED AROUND FIRE AREA, UNTIL AFTER SOLDIERS HAVE COME DOWN HILL AND GONE IN TO SIT IN WOODEN STRUCTURE

THEN DAVE AND KEN GET THEM TO STAND AND GO ACROSS TO WATCH SOLDIERS IN WOODEN STRUCTURE. HEADS DOWN....THEN THEY LIFT HEADS, STARE AT AUDIENCE

DAVE THEN CALLS OUT AND TELLS AUDIENCE TO TURN ABOUT – HE HEARS CHILDREN COMING – CHEERING - on this sound cue – children enter Forest Garden singing "Pack up your troubles" noisily. They begin looking for conkers....

Children act their scene out —audience facing front.

Towards end of their scene, as children make a lot of noise, playing war game version of grandmother's footsteps - shell-shocked SOLDIER calls out and moves forward into children's scene. They see him and speak to him. NURSE COGGIN (played by Barbara – now in COSTUME REPRESENTING a nurse's uniform – appears looking for missing shell-shocked SOLDIER. she talks to children, tells 2 sisters that their mum has just received a telegram and they need to go straight home.

2 children leave at same gate as entrance?? Nurse then leads Dave away - through audience into car park entrance?

TEACHER arrives (with Rev Fletcher?) and leads children out of forest. Gets them to sing 'Pack Up Your Troubles' loudly – or Onwards Christian Soldiers??)

WCT ARE LEFT. COULD GO THROUGH AUDIENCE AGAIN TO HILL, TAKING 'DEAD' POSITIONS STREWN ABOUT IT, WITH NAMES OF DEAD RECITED WITH DRONE ON SOUNDTRACK???
